1. Which planet is known as the Red Planet?

Answer: Mars

Iron minerals in the Martian soil oxidize, giving Mars its reddish appearance.

2. What is the capital of Canada?

Answer: Ottawa

Ottawa became the capital of the Province of Canada in 1857 and later the country's capital.

3. Who wrote Pride and Prejudice?

Answer: Jane Austen

Jane Austen's novel was first published anonymously in 1813.

4. How many sides does a dodecagon have?

Answer: 12

The prefix dodeca- means twelve.

5. Which ocean is the largest?

Answer: Pacific

The Pacific Ocean covers more area than all land on Earth combined.

6. What is the chemical symbol for gold?

Answer: Au

Au comes from the Latin word aurum.

7. Which instrument usually has 88 keys?

Answer: Piano

A standard modern piano has 52 white keys and 36 black keys.

8. What is the smallest prime number?

Answer: 2

Two is divisible only by one and itself, and it is the only even prime.



9. Which country gifted the Statue of Liberty to the United States?

Answer: France

France presented the statue as a gift; it was dedicated in 1886.

10. Which language is commonly cited as having the most native speakers worldwide?

Answer: Mandarin Chinese

Mandarin Chinese is commonly reported as having the largest native-speaker population, although totals vary by classification and source.
